

Since 2004 Carolyn Kadas has taught a course on economic transition in Eastern Europe in the University of Bologna's MIREES Master's in International Politics and Markets programs. Since 2019 she has been an adjunct professor in the Master's in Global Risk program at Johns Hopkins School of International Studies in Bologna, Italy. She also works as a freelance economic and business analyst and editor. She was a journalist and researcher for the Economist Intelligence Unit's office for Eastern Europe based in Vienna in the 1990s.
